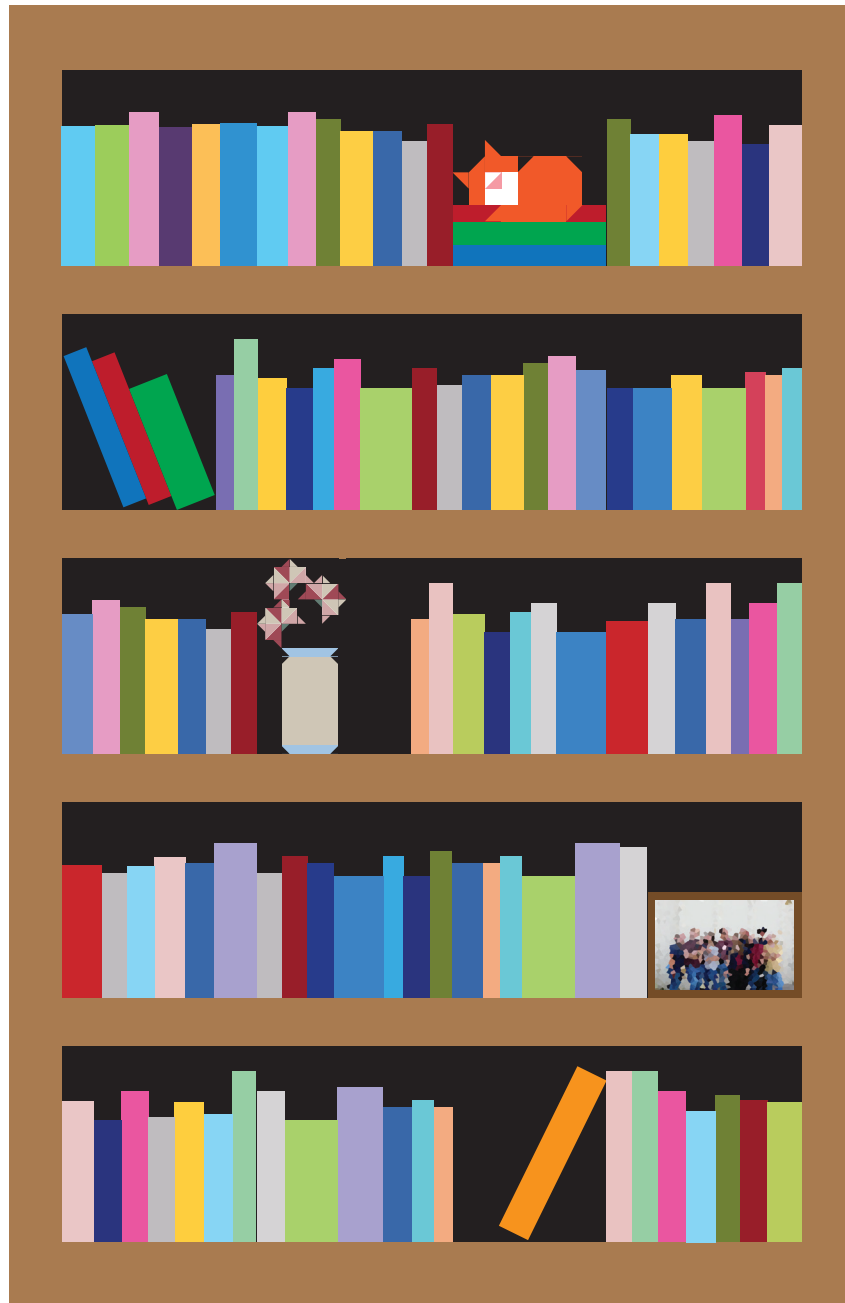


Bookshelf Quilt



Thank you for joining us for Spring Fling! This pattern will show you how to make a bookshelf quilt. This project is great for using up scraps so feel free to replace the Assorted Print fabric with whatever scraps you have.

Materials

- Assortment of Prints
12 fat quarters
- Beige
2 yards
- Black
3 yards
- Backing
4 ½ yards
- Batting
1 yard

Notes

- Finished size: 52"x80"
- LOF=length of fabric
- Use a ¼" seam allowance

Cut the Fabric for Book Blocks

- Assorted fabrics for books
120 rectangles with a variety of widths between 2"-3" and heights between 8"-10½"
- Black
3 strips 5½"x LOF

Piece the Book Blocks

- 1 Line up the short edge of one of the assorted print rectangles to the long edge of a black strip. Trim the black strip to the width of the with of the printed fabric. Make 8

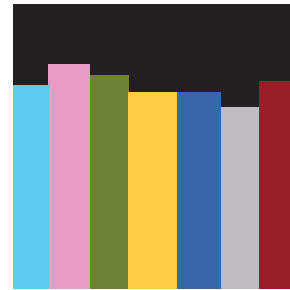
- 2 Join the short edges of the black and print fabrics together and press open



3 Join the long edges of the books together with the print fabrics on the same side. Join 7-8 together until your blocks width greater that 12½”.



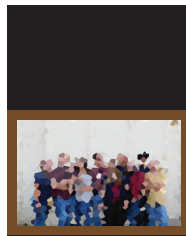
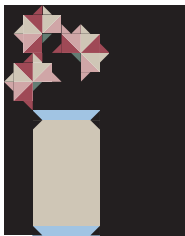
4 Trim your block to 12½” square. Repeat steps 1-3 to make 15 blocks.

Make Specialty Blocks

5 Next you will need to make 5 specialty blocks that are 10” x 12 ½”. Here are 4 ideas, but you will need to find patterns for blocks that will make this quilt personal to you!



6 Cut your sashing and sew your blocks together using the assembly diagram below.
